First identified case of smallpox is found in an Egyptian mummy.




1774

Benjamin Jesty inoculates non-infected individuals with smallpox postulates to prove they could be protected from contracting the disease.

1796

Edward lenner discovers that infection with cowpox could protect a person from smallpox infection. lenner inoculated eight-year-old James Phipps with matter from a cowpox sore. Jenner later inoculated the boy with human smallpox matter and Phipps remained healthy.
